Saturday Morning Workshops

SA-1. Curating Loose Parts - Miriam Belaglovsky, Playful Transformations

Description: This workshop will guide participants to apply educational and design knowledge when curating Loose Parts to maximize children's learning. You will learn the value of Loose Parts, discover how to curate the Loose Parts utilizing different lenses to explore the affordances the Loose Parts offer children, and how to set provocations that promote inquiry.

Core Competency: 5

SA-2. Effective Budgeting for Family Child Care-Abhas Jain

Description: Are you confused about the difference between Expenses, Revenue and Income? If you answered yes to any of these questions, then this is the session for you. Attending this session will jumpstart your efforts to understand your family child care program's financials and understand where the money comes from and where it goes out. This knowledge will empower you to make good financial decisions for your financial future.

Core Competency: 8

SA-3. To Become Calm, Clear and Curious, Learn Tapping - Tijana Coso, Certified EFT

Description: Are you curious how to lower your stress and anxiety with a Tap of your fingers? Literally. In this hands-on program, you will learn Tapping for stress relief. It's easy and effective - you gently tap on points on the face/body which reduces anxiety allowing for clear thinking.

Core Competency: 4

SA-4. Making and Unmaking with Recyclables and Natural Materials - Patty Sinclair, Manager, Education and Curriculum, Bright Horizons

Description: In this session, we will explore the importance of making and unmaking in play-based learning for young children. We will identify types of recyclable and natural materials that engage children in discovery, consider how to create simple provocations with materials to invite children into play, and discuss the steps of the modified engineering design process.

Core Competency: 5

SA-5. Creating Beautiful, Equitable and Socially Just Play Environments - Susan Ferguson, Lead Teacher & Wendy Gonsenhauser, Assistant Director

Description: This presentation focuses on one preschool center's intentional creation of classroom curriculum designs that are physically beautiful and inviting for young children. It will give teachers tools to create their own classroom spaces and includes guidance on how to respectfully talk with children to foster curiosity and growth.

Core Competency: 5

SSA-6. Know Your Why - Your "Why" Makes Your Goals Attainable - Katey Grossman, Trainer for Strong Start and IEPD

Description: What is your why? What is your one goal for the next year? Your goal needs to be about you and for you and defines what you want. A goal should answer: which, what, who, where, when, why. Be as clear and possible in what you want to achieve - the narrower your goal, the more you will understand the steps to achieve it. In this training you will go home with your goal and a plan of action to implement it. Because you will know your WHY!

Core Competency: 8

SA-7. Make Believe PlayLooking Beyond the Kitchen Set - Kelley Ford, Early Childhood Professional and Center Director

Description: Make believe play allows for empathy, social awareness, self-regulation and a way for children to explore the world around them. It is a valuable emotional outlet for children. We will discuss and plan ways to foster children's curiosity with opportunities for make believe beyond the kitchen set and props that can inspire play. Participants will have take-away ideas and inspiration to begin implementing them right away.

Core Competency: 5.

SA-8. No Such Thing as Bad Weather - Rina Zamperion, Statewide Early Education Coordinator, MA Audubon

Description: When the rain pours down, temperatures drop, and sharp winds bite, how do we get our children (and ourselves) excited to go outside? We'll explore fun outdoor activities in a variety of "challenging" weather conditions, troubleshooting ideas and gear suggestions for both children and teachers. Let's find ways to change "bad" weather into exciting and fun learning opportunities!

SA-9. Embracing Families' Funds of Knowledge to Bring Greater Diversity into your Program - Cynthia Parker, Educational Coach

Description: Families possess "funds of knowledge" about themselves, their children, and their community. We will identify 3 ways to obtain these funds of knowledge from families and explore strategies for creatively incorporating them back into your program's environment and curriculum.

Core Competency: 4

SA-10. Ignite Curiosity and Playful Learning Outdoors with Nature's Loose Parts - Victoria Hackett, Outdoor-Classrooms.com & The Secret Gardens Nature Programs

Description: Nature's loose parts provide opportunities for children to play outdoors unencumbered by expectations that are often choreographed by materials and play equipment. They support creative problem solving, cooperative play, fine motor skills and social interaction. Creating invitations for learning outdoors offers a rich pallet of opportunities for igniting children's curiosity and playful learning, and inspires their creative thinking. Through a media presentation, small group hands-on activities and large group you will gain knowledge about loose parts play and the skills to provide and manage the outdoor play environment.

Core Competency: 5

SA-11. A Developmentally Appropriate Approach to Storytelling - Shawn Middleton, Storytelling with Shawn

Description: Add Storytelling to your teaching repertoire! In this uplifting, high-energy and comprehensive workshop participants will feel refreshed and excited to be able to introduce storytelling into their programs. You will learn stories, songs, finger plays and games from around the world that can be used immediately in your curriculum. Explore different storytelling techniques to foster proactive listening, oral language, and writing skills and discover the sheer enjoyment of the magical imagination of stories!

Core Competency: 5

SA-12. The "New Normal" Teacher: The Reinvention and Evolution of Teachers in Response to Change - Adiel Gutierrez, School Director

Description: This workshop presents a roadmap for teachers to respond to pandemic-ridden changes, identify strengths and struggles, and develop an evolved self with strategies to answer the new needs in our profession.

SA-13. Bounces for Babies and Tunes for Tots -Hugh Hanley, Music/Play Specialist

Description: Let's explore the unique ways that infants experience music and movement, and how they develop by engaging in song and music/play as toddlers. SA-1. Stretching Story Time - Linda Schumacher, Early Childhood Specialist

Description: The storybooks you read to children every day can be a rich source of learning! We'll explore the "treasures" to be found in children's books and discuss strategies for engaging children in story time, including children of diverse skill levels, attention spans, and languages. We'll expand each book by brainstorming activities that can be planned for all learning domains.

Core Competency: 5

SA-2. Effective Social Media Marketing - Abhas Jain

Description: Do you want to effectively market your programs to millennial parents using Social Media and other technology solutions? This is the session for you. This session will jumpstart your efforts to formulate and implement your digital and social media marketing strategy. Description: Natural Loose Parts offer limitless possibilities to enrich children's play and learning! Become inspired to integrate natural loose parts into your curriculum and enable children of all ages and abilities to develop creativity, critical thinking skills, and more.

SA-5. Reimagine Your Outdoor Space for Creative Play and Learning - Erica Quigley and Sara Brunelle, Landscape Designers and Educational Consultants

Description: Ready to improve your outdoor space for creative play and inquiry? Get inspired to re-imagine your outdoor environment based on best practices. Topics include: curriculum goals, loose parts, safety, low-cost improvements, and organizing space into landscape "rooms."

Description: Sensory integration and regulation are key to how we experience and function within the world. Participants in this workshop will gain an understanding of sensory integration, sensory discrimination, praxis, and how challenges in these areas may show up in early childhood programs.

SU-1. Planning Activities for Child Care: From Teachable Moments to Intentional Teaching - Linda Schumacher, Early Childhood Specialist Core

But it's also important for educators to be purposeful and intentional when they plan for a balanced curriculum including all the learning domains.
